- (1) Like other national parks, Everglades is a piece of wilderness set aside to be preserved in its natural state. (2) It is a park of birds mammals fish reptiles amphibians and of plants.
- (3) Andrew cut through the heart of the park, felling everything in its path. (4) Animals in the park survived well. (5) But the storm left behind a tangled mess of dead and dying plants, lying in torn-up ground.
- (6) The last hurricane that seriously damaged Everglades swept through in 1960. (7) That time the park recovered well. (8) Some fallen trees resprouted. (9) Seeds from similar plants blew on the winds or were carried in by animals.
- (10) To the north, land <u>has been</u> drained and cleared for towns, ranches, and farms. (11) The natural flow of water through the park has changed, and chemicals seep into the water. (12) Housing developments have gone up right next to the park. (13) And foreign plants have been brought in and planted just outside the park. (14) But they are a problem. (15) <u>There</u> seeds spread like wildfire, grow fast, and thrive in disturbed soil. (16) Once they take hold, they are nearly impossible to get rid of.
- (17) Now park scientists fear that foreign plants will invade the hurricane-damaged areas, take hold, and drive out native plants. (18) This would change the <u>parks plant life</u>. (19) It would also change the animal life, because animals depend on native plants for food and for places to nest and raise their young.
- (20) No one knows how a big change will take place or how it will affect the songbirds wading birds the raccoons bobcats deer alligators snakes and tree frogs. (21) Park scientists can only wait and see.
- (22) Natural scientists are also concerned about damage to the mangrove swamps<u>along southern</u> biscayne bay, where Andrew came ashore
- (23) The storm surge spent itself on a string of small barrier islands, which are long narrow sand islands which parallel the mainland and protect the coast. (24) Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, and Virginia all have barrier islands. (25) But the <u>hurricanes winds</u> and waves battered the shore, which was lined with swamps of mangrove trees. (26) The raging winds shredded the mangroves. (27) When mangroves are lost, many food chains and food webs are affected.
- (28) It will be years before anyone can tell how badly Andrew damaged the mangrove swamps and the food chains that begin in them. (29) Florida has lost many miles of mangrove swamps in the past thirty years. (30) They have been filled, cleared and built on. (31) The remaining ones are precious
